Mind Trekkers Road Show returns to Schoolcraft

The Mind Trekkers team, comprised of MTU undergraduate and graduate students, provides inspirational guidance in each exciting and stimulating presentation.

Founded in 2010, the group displays the wonders of STEM. Their expos and events are presented nationwide and in local and regional institutions such as Schoolcraft to showcase engaging activities to young students.

News briefs

GLOBAL

U.N. SANCTIONS, NORTH KOREAN WARNINGS

North Korea has accused the U.S. of opting for “political, economic and military confrontation.” The communist state views recent U.N. sanctions as attempts to starve them of fuel and income for its national defense and a North Korean ambassador condemned the resolution as “illegal.” The measures restricting Chinese crude oil imports, banning textile exports and banning new work visas for international workers were approved after North Korea’s sixth and largest nuclear test earlier this month.

“The forthcoming measures by DPRK [the Democratic Republic of Korea] will make the U.S. suffer the greatest pain it has ever experienced in its history,” ambassador Han Tae Song warned the U.N. conference in Geneva. He went on to explain that no measures could reverse the regime’s nuclear progress which reportedly has reached completion.

NATIONAL

IRMA’S FURY LASHES FLORIDA, SOUTHEAST COAST

As she brewed in the Atlantic, Hurricane Irma broke records as a historically massive Category 5 storm spanning thousands of miles. By the time Irma battered the shores of the Florida Keys, her strength weakened to that of a Category 4 with winds maxed around 185 miles per hour, and eventually diminished to a tropical depression by the time she hit North Carolina. The storm has left over 12 million people without power in the humid southern heat and has already claimed at least 11 lives in Florida and Georgia, adding to the 37 victims from the islands of the Caribbean and 10 from Cuba. The death toll is expected to rise as damage is assessed and recovery efforts continue, although destruction has thankfully been far less than predicted which is a hopeful indication.

STATE

MICHIGAN’S GRAY WOLVES THREATENED

Considered legislation in the U.S. House of Representatives as of Sept. 12 would strip away the protections granted by The Endangered Species Act to gray wolves in Michigan and other states surrounding the Great Lakes. The House Federal Lands Subcommittee adopted a bill that would reverse the decision made less than two months ago after an appeals court in the nation’s capital ruled that the protection afforded wolves in Michigan, Minnesota and Wisconsin should continue unless further study indicates otherwise. For several years, The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service has vainly attempted to de-list the few hundred gray wolves in the Upper Peninsula and larger populations from neighboring states from protection under the Endangered Species Act.

LOCAL

PUMP PRICES WON’T PLUNGE

Gas prices continue climbing in metro Detroit. According to GasBuddy, the average price in gas has risen 0.3 cents per gallon in the past week alone with the local average now at \$2.64 per gallon. Compared to only a month ago, gas in metro Detroit is up 17 cents per gallon. Nationally, the average has gone up 31 cents from a month ago and 48 cents higher than September. Comparing these to other gas prices in September of recent years, gas was \$2.27 per gallon in 2016 and 2015 and \$3.53 per gallon in 2014. It is highly likely that this rise is due in part to the impact of Hurricanes Harvey and Irma as well as a potentially active hurricane season..

students and all students by giving them exposure to different areas of STEM,” Associate Dean of Science Charles Hayes. “With the demonstrations Mind Trekkers brings, they can see how these demonstrations fit into that STEM pathway.”

At Schoolcraft, expect the festival to be its usual hybrid of science fair and instructional carnival. Over 3,000 people from the surrounding community are already projected to attend over the course of two days. The high-energy atmosphere promotes hands-on learning and interaction between volunteers and all attendees who will be encouraged to move about each demonstration table at their own pace.

There will be up to 120 unique activities this year, including experiments analyzing centripetal force, simple DNA extraction, vortex cannons and outdoor implosions. When asked about his outlook on

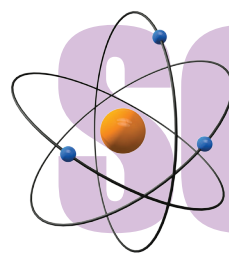
the event, Schoolcraft engineering student Nick Misiak responded “It’s impressive and exciting to see Schoolcraft host an event that exposes the next generation of college students to the incredibly thought-provoking innovations and technology that modern science has to offer. Hopefully this event will inspire someone to become a pioneer in future scientific endeavors.”

The 2017 Southeast Michigan Science & Engineering Festival will take place from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. both days with demonstrations and expositions set up all-around the Physical Education building, Applied Science and Biomedical Technology Center.

Preserving the past for the future

Importance of recognizing history through monument preservation

As the American political arena is deeply divided due to recent extremist events across the nation, many people have demanded the removal or defamation of historical monuments and sites, particularly those related to the Confederate Army that seceded The Union to initiate what would go on to be the bloodiest war fought on American soil, the Civil War.

Most statues of Confederate soldiers were actually erected in the half-century period that followed war’s end in an effort to reconcile the union between north and south as well as to cement the narrative of the south’s lost cause. The common objection to these statues today is that they serve to publicly honor their subjects.

With any middle school education in history, we must know to view these monuments as haunting and cautionary tales. While the original intent of their erection was not to warn or educate future Americans on the heinous practice of slavery and secession in its name, it is our duty in the present to be mature and enlightened enough to recognize them as such. The very fact that these statues were built in prominent public places is a rather powerful lesson in American history.

In these cases, the purpose of public monuments is to oblige us to deal with and move past our nation’s turbulent history and the changes of human nature with time.

But the iconoclasm on display now in American politics is more so a critique of American constitutionalism. President Trump was mocked for suggesting that progressive activists would demand the removal of George Washington or Thomas Jefferson after being unsatisfied with the removal statutes of rebel soldiers. But sure enough, the Lincoln Memorial in the nation’s capital was spray painted by vandals soon after and another statue of the Great Emancipator was torched in Chicago.

People have called for the abandonment of the Jefferson Memorial and the removal of Washington and Jackson’s names from public places for their ownership of slaves. Journalists have even gone so far as to call for Mount Rushmore’s destruction. For

many on the left wing of politics, Confederate statues are merely small obstacles in forgetting a much larger “problem,” the past.

This criticism is common among so-called activists because they feel compelled to liberate society from any trace of tradition and history as contributions to a glorious new future. It was this very mindset that sparked Mao’s Cultural Revolution in China, the rise of communism in Soviet Russia and the sanitation of art and religion in France during the French Revolution.

These depraved ideologies claimed thousands of innocent lives. While progressives shouldn’t be equated with that at this point, they’re trapped by a similar, dangerous conceptual thought. These activists believe the existence of these statues constantly remind us of a painful past that must be forgotten and should be demolished at all costs.

But the past is always with us and must be kept in mind to avoid ever slipping back into those dark chapters of history. Toppling statues or prohibiting free speech will never evict hatred from a person’s heart, for only education and recognition of a troubled past while working toward a better tomorrow for everyone can do that. ♦

Want to keep children safe?

Avoid Contact Sports

From a young age, everyone has heard over and over again, go out and exercise. The NFL even sponsors “Fuel Up to Play 60” to encourage kids to go out and play for at least 60 minutes a day. While kids should be putting in some sort of physical activity everyday, to what extremes should they do it to?

There are some high impact sports out there that are just too simply dangerous for young ones such as football, hockey and lacrosse. There is alarming data out there that says how concussions are rising for the youth especially in sports such as football. For example, CBC published an article that includes Nigerian-American forensic pathologist and neuropathologist, Dr. Bennet Omalu, quoting that your child is more likely to die before the age of 42 in a violent means if they play contact sports and experience multiple blows to the head.

Speaking from personal experience, no kid should ever have to go through having a concussion especially younger than 16 years of age. Concussions have serious affects on a child’s life such as making it more difficult for them to receive an education at school, developing mental disorders or even thoughts of suicide. Dr. Omalu also states that children who play contact sports have increased their risk of committing suicide and developing serious psychiatric illnesses by two to four times.

It is hard to send a child out onto the football field with a helmet as their best protection. Aside from

concussions, there are numerous other opportunities for injury that any child could encounter such as torn ACLs, twisted and sprained elbows and ankles, bruises and broken bones.

According to some sports injury statistics collected by John Hopkins Medicine, more than 3.5 million children up to 14 years of age get hurt playing sports or taking part in recreational activities annually. With all of this research and supporting evidence out there proving how contact sports are dangerous to kids, it begs the question, “How can kids still get in the physical activity they need without the risk for long term injury?”

For every problem, there is usually a solution. There are a plethora of ways to exercise other than just playing football, hockey or even lacrosse. There other safer sports such as swimming, basketball, baseball, track and field and tennis. It is entirely possible to still take on the tradition of passing the ball around with your parental unit without compromising the brain. There is also flag football which has the fun of the sport without most of the dangers associated with tackle football. At a certain

age, teenagers can start going to work out at gyms so long as they are supervised by a parent or guardian.

Another way to prevent long term injuries is just by eating and drinking healthy. Everyone should be eating all the nutrients and portion size recommended by doctors and drinking at least eight glasses of water a day. It is possible for a child to still live a healthy life without risking their future. ♦

You won’t be able to work as many hours, if at all, so when you graduate, you’ll have more debt, from student

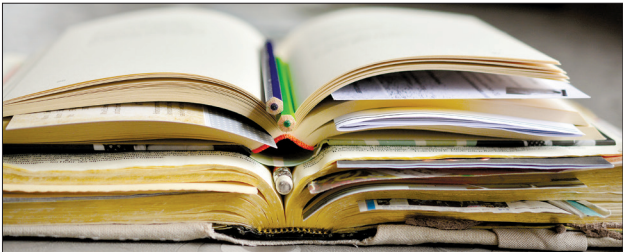

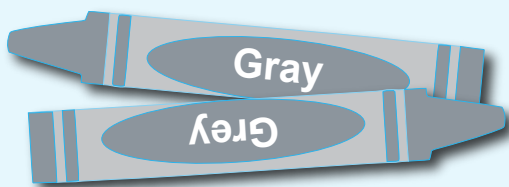

Dear Writing Fellows,

I always get confused when I see the word "grey" spelled like "gray." What is the correct spelling? Why do some words have this different spelling but mean the same thing?

**Hoping for Advice,
A Fellow Student in Need**



Dear Fellow Student,

Your confusion with the words "grey" and "gray" is normal. This is a common misunderstanding that many people have when they try to spell this word in various contexts.

So, is the correct form "grey" or is it "gray"? The answer is that they are both correct and acceptable ways of spelling this tricky word. However, the thing that separates the usage of these two spellings is often the place.

English, like many other languages, has different dialects. The most common distinction is between American English and British English, which are similar, but also unique. In Britain, they spell "grey" with an "e." In America, we spell "gray" with an "a."

One trick to help distinguish the words is to remember that England

and other places that speak "Queen's English" spell the word "grey" with the letter "e." Whereas, America and the word "gray" both have the letter "a." The color "gray" is just one of the gray areas of the English language.

Other words have various spellings due to these differences in dialect as well, and they include British words such as "travelled" and "centre" that are written as "traveled" and "center" in the United States. It can often be difficult to understand how these words are written because they sound the same. One of the easiest ways is to know where the word comes from (or to search for it online) and determine what context (especially place) that you will be using it in.

These cloudy words do not have to be an issue anymore, your gray areas can be crystal clear, and your writing can reflect your new understanding of the relationship between context and spelling.

Celebrating Navratri

Indian tradition returns to Schoolcraft for 11th year

The Schoolcraft Asian Student Association is proud to host the 11th annual Navratri event on Sept. 24 from 6 to 11 p.m. in the VisTaTech Center. Tickets can be purchased either in advance for \$15 by contacting Schoolcraft Student Activities Office at 734-462-4422 or at the door for \$20. There is no charge for children under the age of 5.

“Navratri,” known as nine nights in Hindi, is the period of festivities dedicated to Durga, the goddess of strength and power. During the 10 days and the nine nights of festivities, nine different forms of the goddess are worshiped with great passion and total devotion. It is widely celebrated in India and by the Indian diaspora around the world as one of the most important festivals of the year. Individuals can celebrate this holiday by fasting, performing different Poojas—the recitation of religious hymns—and through prayer and meditation, all dedicated to the Goddess Durga.

Dance in different forms such as Raas and Garba are also used to worship the goddess. Garba is a fluid and graceful dance form that is often performed in circles with elaborate footwork and clapping. The dance form of Raas is also very powerful, characterized by its use of dandiya—narrow sticks—which are used both aesthetically as ornamentation as well as musically to keep rhythm.

With the United States almost 8,000 miles from India, there are not many opportunities to celebrate India’s most cherished holidays in a large setting. When asked why she decided to begin this event 11 years ago, Anna

Maheshwari, Faculty Advisor of Asian Student Association, answered, “I wanted to bring Navratri to the Schoolcraft family and to the community at large to showcase the rich Indian traditions and culture of India.”

The first Asian Student Association Navratri event on campus took place in 2007 and a decade later, it is still going strong. When describing how this event has progressed over the years, Elizabeth Machniak, the administrative assistant in the Student Activities Office and one of the most key helpers for this event said, “There were 250 people in attendance its first year, which for a first-time event was fantastic. By 2011, attendance had reached 1,000 people. When it started, the campus was unaware of what Navratri was...but what actually takes place is far beyond what we could have imagined. It is a wonderful opportunity for cultural enrichment on campus.”

A big part of the Navratri event is being sponsored by Arjun Bajaj, a dual enrolled student and member of the Asian Student Association at Schoolcraft College. He requested a donation to be made by his father instead of a birthday vacation.

Schoolcraft’s Navratri will be a great night full of celebrating Indian culture with awards to honor best dancer, best

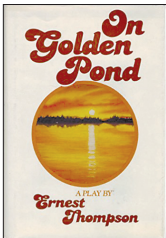
SEPTEMBER: “ON GOLDEN POND”

Finally, she’s crossing the threshold

Lana Del Rey’s “Lust for Life” proves change in the singer’s state of being

Thanks to pain-evoked lyrics put to poetry, Lana Del Rey has become the adored queen of melancholy in alternative pop.

Her fifth album “Lust for Life” luxuriates in warmly concise tempos that recall pop music before the era of rock n’ roll. Del Rey shies away from the deeper, recognizable riffs of her 2013 “Ultraviolence” and the glossiness of 2015’s “Honeymoon.” This album serves her flower-crowned cult-following in cementing her image as a glamorous icon of decades past, trapped in the City of Angels where raw musical talent such as hers is second to streaming, computer generated noise and auto-tune.

The album is reminiscent of gloomy pop from the mid-60s, with modern touches of the trap-era, allusions to modern problems and a gift for writing songs that exceed five minutes in duration. It’s densely open, with rather surprising yet traditionally Lana-esque lyrics richly embedded in each line.

As with records prior, the self-proclaimed “Gangster Nancy Sinatra” fearlessly indulges into visions of nostalgia through allusions to festivals of the 1960s as heard in “Coachella - Woodstock in My Mind” and deeply set praise for rock icons such as Mötley Crüe in “Heroin.”

The singer has disclosed to fans and interviewers alike that “Heroin,” the 14th track on an album of 16, is her favorite, for it holds a very special and symbolic place in her heart.

“Isn’t life crazy, I said, now that I’m singing with Sean?,” she sings on “Tomorrow Never Came,” with Sean Ono Lennon. Sean’s father, former Beatle John Lennon was incredibly influential to Del Rey’s art, so much so as he was with his son. The track is a proud testament to that influence with echoing instruments and crooning vocals. She sings along with yet another of her influences, bittersweet Gypsy queen Stevie Nicks, for the mournful, allegorical “Beautiful People, Beautiful Problems.”

Rappers A\$AP Rocky and Playboi Carti stop by with flashy features on “Summer Bummer” and “Groupie Love,” though their verses do nothing to compliment the pensive dialogue of their host. The Weeknd is featured dancing on the H of the Hollywood Sign with Del Rey for the album’s title track and seems much more grateful for working so closely with her.

While records prior indicate Del Rey’s love affair with sorrow, this one differs as she recognizes and embraces change in herself. “Get Free” opens with the singer explaining her cross over the threshold into the reveal of her heart as she goes on to outline a “modern manifesto” to move “out of the black, and into the blue.”

Though that blue is undefined, it’s a hopeful ending for a singer who has often become lost in her own mythology and who has openly suffered discomfort with life for many years. “Get Free” completes the album with comparative lyrics from her iconic sophomore monologue and song “Ride” as she commits to recognizing some of her faults: “sometimes it feels like I’ve got a war in my mind. I wanna get off, but I keep riding the ride.”

For the first time smiling on the cover of one of her records, daisies in her hair, Lana Del Rey has proven to the world yet again that genuine, unfiltered talent still exists in music today. Since its release in July, she’s announced she will be touring the world for “Lust for Life” in the coming year. The record continues topping charts on Beats Radio One and is available on iTunes for \$6.99. 🎵

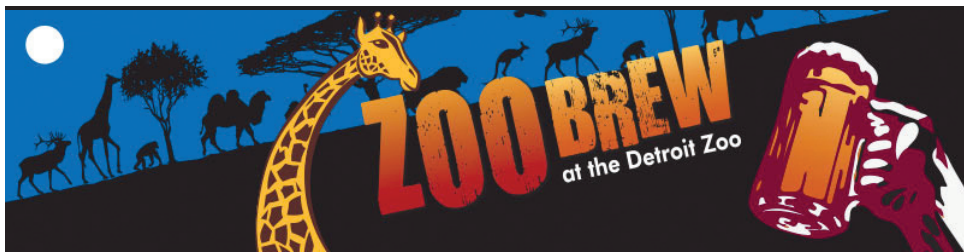

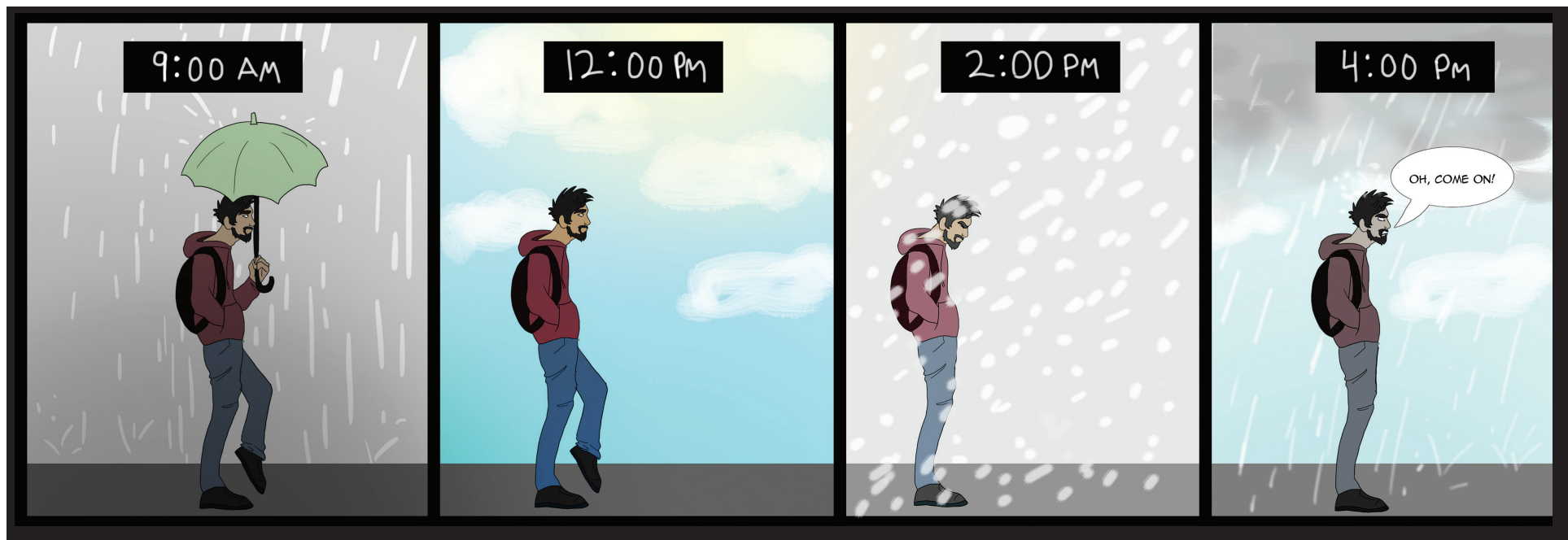

5. Shred and serve on a bun or roll of your choice.

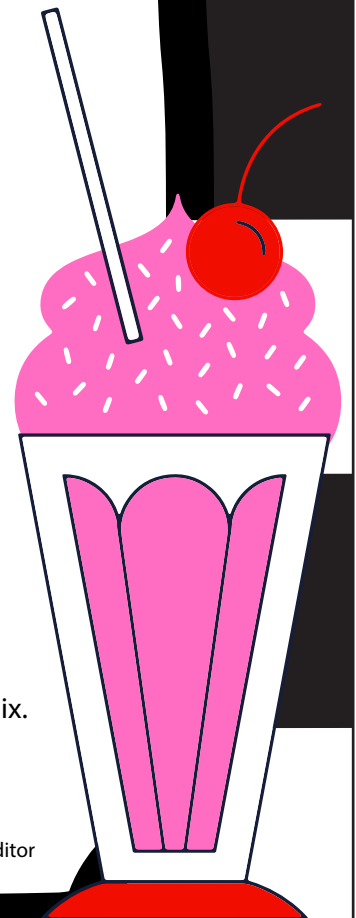


Ingredients:

1 bottle red punch (Like Hawaiian Punch)
1 bottle clear lemon-lime soda
1 bottle blue Powerade Zero
Crushed ice
Clear glasses

Directions:

1. The key to stacking the colors is by layering the colors from most sugary (most dense) to least sugary, so make sure that each of your beverages has different levels of sugar.
2. Fill a clear glass with crushed ice or smaller cubes.
3. Start with the most sugary drink and slowly pour into the glass.
4. Pouring over the ice helps slow down the flow even more; if you have trouble, try pouring along the side of the glass or over the back of a spoon.
5. The slower that you can pour, the less the layers will mix.
6. Repeat with the medium-sugary drink, then low or zero sugar drink.
