The Schoolcraft College Board of Trustees is comprised of seven members elected to their positions by the Schoolcraft College District. These officials work collaboratively over a six-year term creating policies for Schoolcraft College. On Jan. 23 at 7 p.m., Dillon Breen was sworn in by the honorable Mike Kowall as a new member of the Board of Trustees.

Breen was elected by voters to fill the vacated position of Trustee Eric Stempien whose term ended in December 2018. Breen was joined by his parents and grandmother, who witnessed as he took the oath to serve Schoolcraft College to the best of his abilities.

Breen is a lifelong resident of the city of Livonia where he attended Livonia Public Schools, graduating from Stevenson High School in 2011. Thereafter, he attended Schoolcraft College from

which he graduated with an Associate of Arts degree in 2014. While attending Schoolcraft, Breen was involved in various organizations on campus such as the Catholic Student Association and Omicron Iota chapter of Phi Theta Kappa. After Schoolcraft, he attended Calvin College in Grand Rapids where he earned a bachelor's degree in Geology, minoring in Geography. Additionally, Breen holds an Environmental Analyst and Land Resources Analyst Certificate from Au Sable Institute of Environmental Studies in Mancelona, Mich.

Breen has been actively engaged in the community and local politics for over a decade, contributing time and dedication while serving as a member of the Livonia Human Relations Commission from 2012 until 2018. He also served on the Livonia Local Officers Commission from 2015 until 2018. He has previously worked for the Michigan State Senate as District Director for Senator Mike Kowall, State Majority floor leader.

Schoolcraft provided Breen with the academic support, resources and experiences necessary to enhance critical leadership skills and facilitate his readiness to proceed toward his career development. Ultimately, it was his passion for public service and wanting to provide Schoolcraft

with his support that resulted in his decision to run for the position.

"I have been involved in local politics for over a decade and felt a passion for public service for quite some time. After seeing an incumbent trustee had yet to file to run for re-election, I made the decision that I could be of service to Schoolcraft and put my name in for consideration by the voters," said Breen as he expressed how he made the decision to run for his newly attained position.

Students, the community, faculty and staff can expect great things from Breen as he begins the first month of his six-year term as the youngest member of the Schoolcraft College Board of Trustees.

"I hope to continue Schoolcraft's legacy of fiscal responsibility, while providing oversight and transparency where needed. I believe I will bring a passionate and youthful voice to the table, providing a new perspective to the board of trustees," states Breen in reference to his future contributions.

Schoolcraft Board of Trustees meetings are open to anyone interested in attending. They are held on the last Wednesday of every month at 7 p.m. in the Jeffress Center, Rm. JC228. The next meeting will be held Feb. 27.

Learning Center has added Math Services

Whether in need of writing support or an extra push to stay on the path of success, the Learning Center Tutoring Lab will begin to expand throughout campus, providing additional services to students.

In an effort to assist students in achieving and maintaining their academic potential, Learning Support Services will now offer “Drop-In Tutoring” to those students enrolled in MATH 053 and MATH 113 courses.

This free service began Jan. 29 and will be available every Tuesday from 1 to 3 p.m. in Biomedical Technical Center Rm. 225 and Liberal Arts Building Rm. 310. These sessions will focus on questioning techniques and implementation methods developed in order to guide a student’s

learning and establish a sense of self-teaching.

While “Drop-In Tutoring” is specific to MATH 053 and 113 courses, the Learning Center Tutoring Lab will continue to provide support to Schoolcraft’s variety of courses including science and other math courses. Additionally, the Learning Center provides writing support through the Writing Support Studio, which is available for all courses. Students can meet for peer-led guidance to improve on technical writing, formatting, brainstorming and editing. Writing support services are available Monday through Thursday from 10 a.m. until 6 p.m., Friday 10 a.m. until 5 p.m. and Saturday from noon until 4 p.m. The Writing Support Studio is located within the Learning Center in Bradner Library, Rm. 119.

Further support services include Academic Success Coaching, International Learning Support and Peer Assisted Learning (PAL). Academic Success Coaching provides students a one-on-one meeting with a success coach to discuss techniques to improve upon academic success and the development of study skills, time-management methods, test-taking strategies and goal-setting skills.

For information regarding Academic Success Coaching or to schedule an appointment, students can contact the Learning Center at 734-462-4436 or via email at LC@schoolcraft.edu. International Learning Support provides international students and community members with an opportunity to connect, learn, on and support one another via small groups, study groups and tutoring. With that in mind, international students are able to strengthen and exercise their English skills in a comfortable and engaging environment.

Peer Assistant Learning (PAL) provides structured study sessions

for specific courses facilitated by a trained peer who has previously done well in that specific course. “Typically, PAL’s hold a session that’s separate to a lecture to go over the material covered in class and answer questions about the homework,” said Carrie Ross, PAL for Physics 181 with Professor Chris Wood. “Teachers do their best to explain things in a way that everyone can understand, but sometimes you need a different explanation or perspective to understand concepts.” This support service is available within the first couple of weeks following the start of class and is offered as a walk-in service through the Learning Support Center.

Schoolcraft alumna pampers pets with small business

In the fall of 2017, Courtney Novack, owner and founder of Forever a Puppy Pet Services, began working for her father's house cleaning business, which was co-owned by her stepmother. While working alongside her family,

she recognized a greater level of excitement while cleaning homes who owned animals. Ultimately, Novack decided that she wanted to own a pet-related business.

Novack attended Schoolcraft College from 2015 until winter 2018. She now holds an associate degree in Small Business and Entrepreneurship.

"Getting my degree has helped me be steps ahead of those who start their business from literal scratch. It made me aware of the hurdles to jump and the bumps in the road to avoid," said Novack. "I am forever grateful for what I learned at Schoolcraft because it's not only a big part of my success, it has made me a great business owner and an even better leader."

Novack is very passionate about caring for each pet as if it were her own, making it her mission to help both the owner and pets feel as comfortable as possible in following their normal routine. "If I leave a home and the pet's tail is not wagging, I did not do my job," said Novack referencing her approach on caring for pets. Her focus is to help the owners feel that their pet is being cared for, ensuring they never feel lonely or bored while their owner is away.

Novack initially began her services by creating a website describing the services offered. "I have always wanted to run my own business, which is why I got my degree in small business and entrepreneurship," said Novack. "I have always been a writer, so I figured my business would involve blogging and being more online based."

Alongside her independent contractor, Forever a Puppy Pet Services offers dog walking in 20 to 40-minute sessions, which can be purchased in either a weekly or monthly bundle. Additional services include pet-sitting, which is available as daily visits and overnight care. These amenities are available to any non-human family member including dogs, cats, birds, hamsters and even fish. Finally, Novack provides flexibility in her services to meet the needs of each client and their pets.

One of her clients, Schoolcraft Professor Deborah Taracuk, rates Novack's care as a ten-out-of-ten.

Taracuk's dog Riley was very malnourished and did not trust people when he was first adopted. Novack helped him learn that humans can be kind and that he is safe around them.

"Courtney was an important part of providing Riley with a structured routine. She is also gentle and very kind. Riley not only trusts her, he looks forward to his walks with her," said Taracuk. Novack has been providing dog-walking services to Taracuk since September when she injured her knee. After seeing Novack's ad for her pet-sitting business on the next-door neighborhood blog and a meet-and-greet with her and Riley, Taracuk began working with her.

"I could only take him so far while hobbling around on my crutches. That's where Courtney came in," said Taracuk. "She came regularly every afternoon and has been walking him regularly ever since. I am now able to walk Riley again. We walk morning and evening, but Courtney still comes at least three days a week to take Riley for a long afternoon walk while I am at work."

Forever a Puppy Pet Services is home-based for now with services provided to homes in Plymouth, Novi, Northville and Livonia. However, a goal of Novack's is to create a boarding facility to provide an alternative option for owner's who would feel more comfortable in that manner. Additionally, she would like to encourage clients to donate old toys and beds. She plans to donate them to no-kill shelters for animals that don't have a happy home yet.

Students Mentoring Students

Each year, chapters of the Phi Theta Kappa International Honor Society complete what is known as an Honors in Action project. The specific purpose of this project is to provide members with an opportunity for growth and development of leadership skills as well as engaging with the community both on campus and in the surrounding area. It is through the Honors in Action project that members facilitate a plan of action to meet real world needs and develop more action-orientated and concrete problem-solving skills while researching a targeted Honor Study topic.

During the Fall 2018 semester, the Omicron Iota chapter of Phi Theta Kappa completed their Honors in Action project, employing a focus on the loss of interpersonal connections in middle school students. Further, they were determined to research how this contributed to increased school violence, more specifically school shootings. Through conducting extensive and collaborative re-

search, the team categorized the data collected into three specific components: mental/emotional factors, environmental factors and individual characteristics. Each of these components consists of different factors. For instance, environmental contributors refer to the relationships between a child and their parents and/or caregivers, socioeconomic status or learning environment. On the other hand, mental and emotional factors refer to how a child processes and encompasses their emotions.

"The mission of this program is to provide helping hands to middle school students throughout our community," said Steffanie Hills, President of the Omicron Iota chapter. "We encourage, inspire and motivate students by giving them a mentor, academic support and tutoring and a reliable relationship. We do this with the hope of reducing school violence, re-establishing lost connections and improving academic performance."

Currently, the Students Mentoring Students program has partnered with three local middle schools: Emerson Middle School,

Frost Middle School and Stevenson Middle School. Staff who coordinate with the mentors are very hopeful of future impact. "I am optimistic about having this program at Emerson because I observe the impact firsthand," said Mary Allison, Title 1 staff at Emerson Middle School. "Middle school students want to look good to their peers and are often hesitant to raise their hand for help. When a 'college kid' just sits down next to them, they are more open to accepting instruction and encouragement."

Furthermore, the success and growth of this program relies deeply on mentor participation as additional schools, such as the Garden City middle schools, are already requesting mentorship support for their students.

"Recruitment of mentors is very crucial in order for the program to succeed and anyone can help by volunteering their time to help mentor the middle school students," said Drake LaForge, Vice President of Omicron Iota, regarding future growth and success of the program.

Becoming a mentor is open to all students, faculty and staff, alumni and members of the community. Students should hold a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher, in addition to

having earned a 3.0 or higher in all Math, Science and English courses. Individuals who are interested in becoming a mentor will need to complete an application as well as a background check. The duration of this process can take up to a few weeks for approval, and it is recommended that students who are interested apply as soon as possible.

Phi Theta Kappa members who volunteer as a mentor will earn stars toward achieving their par-excellence membership, a letter of recommendation and hours may be applied toward volunteer hours required. Mentors will gain a sense of personal satisfaction knowing they are participating in a program of impact in the lives of young adults.

"Our children are facing more and more pressures," said Allison. "The complex world often seems unnavigable to them. I hope members of the Schoolcraft Community will reflect about someone who made a positive difference in their lives. They can be that difference for a struggling middle school kid."

It's been two years since Future released an album or solo studio effort. In 2017, Future dropped not one but two albums, both of which were self-titled. 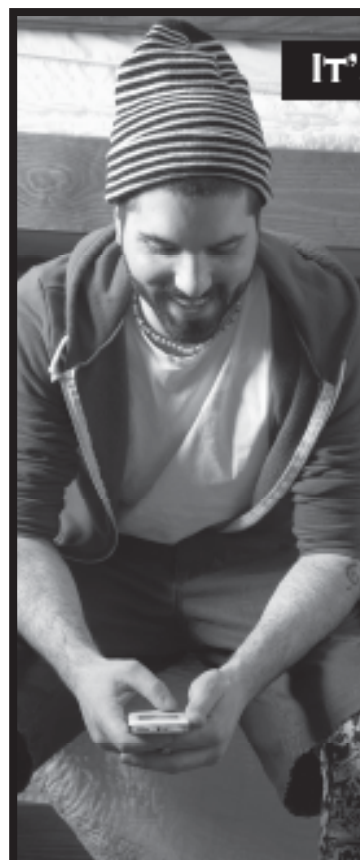

Dear Peer Consultants,

I have an English paper due soon and I am quite nervous. I seem to struggle with not having long enough paragraphs, and as a result, my papers are too short. What is the best way to combat this?

An Anxious Student

Dear Anxious Student,

Do not be nervous! Writing lengthy papers can be tricky, but there is a secret formula that you can follow to keep you aligned. First, consider your opening sentences; these are your main ideas. A good rule of thumb is to always be sure to elaborate on these. Try giving more in-depth descriptions or examples about your main ideas. These can be experiences, research, or anything you can think of that would increase their meaning and support the statement. Here is an example:

I greatly prefer cats over dogs as a pet. One reason would be that dogs tend to be very hyper and active creatures. They need more attention from their owners and, as a result, it takes more effort to care for them. Cats, on the other hand, are more relaxed and quiet creatures. They simply sleep all day and only beg for attention when they want to eat; they make perfect pets because of it.

Place such examples after your opening statement so that they flow well with the paper. Be sure to keep such examples three to four sentences long at most.

You can also play with wording to create either shorter or longer sentences. Be sure to mix them up throughout the paragraph by having a simple statement then following up with more elaboration. This not only adds more length to your paper, but also makes the read a bit more interesting. One version you could use could be, "Cats make great pets for a family" or "Having a cat for a pet adds another member to the family, which brings much joy and happiness."

Another tip is to always look back and revise. Look back at your paper and all the examples you have provided to see if there is anywhere you can add more, remove some, or change things up. If you have trouble with this, you can always have a friend read through it as well.

We hope that this helps with creating longer and more descriptive papers. You can always come back to this information for use on any paper. You will notice that your papers will become filled with even more valuable elaborations and examples, and achieve desired length.
