Welcome back to a synergetic Schoolcraft

College to undergo building developments and relocation of programs

On Aug. 26, 2019, Schoolcraft College President, Dr. Conway Jeffress addressed faculty and staff during the Fall Welcome Back breakfast, presenting on the development of changes that are to begin both on and off campus. This update comes less than six months after the announcement of the collaboration between Schoolcraft College and their partners, Saint Joseph Mercy Health System and Integrated Health Associates, who announced in March 2019 they would construct a new medical facility on Schoolcraft Campus.

Furthermore, Jeffress discussed additional changes to the garage housing the motorcycles on the Radcliff campus, the Applied Science and Fitness Center on main campus and the purchasing of a warehouse which would be located adjacent to the Public Safety Training facility.

"Almost all of these projects have a domino effect to them," states Jeffress. "In every project you see here, there's a connection. There is a facility that produces a revenue stream. There is a talent base that produces talent for our students and there is a place for our students to work for the jobs available in that location."

Changes to the Applied Science

(AS) building are expected to be the largest of the developments with Jeffress referring to it as "strictly a Schoolcraft project." Funding partially by a state grant, development will add 36,700 square feet to the AS building allowing for the addition of several new programs within the building.

"This will allow us to do a couple of things," states Jeffress. "It will allow us to expand the nursing and medical operations, which is a primary thrust of this structure. Secondly, even out the building. It will take advantage of the grade between the front and back of building."

The Ph.D of baking

Chef Heather Moore becomes Schoolcraft's first master baker

There are fewer than 200 master bakers in the U.S. and Schoolcraft has its first one: Chef Heather Moore.

In April, Moore traveled to San Antonio to take the practical exam hosted by the Culinary Institute of America, which was her second attempt to get the certification. Her certification was a long time coming and Moore did a lot to prepare for it.

Moore's first step was applying for qualification from the Retail Bakers' Association (RBA) and receiving qualification for testing. RBA is the association that the application for her Master Baker Certification is through. Then, they base your qualifications off a candidate's work history and credentials.

"Because I'm already a certified executive pastry chef, which helps with my credentials portion, I got to skip the certified baker certification because I already had the credentials," Moore said. "Then they look at your work history. So then if they clear you for that, then you have to take a written exam." That exam evaluated her knowledge of the science and history of baking, which she passed.

Afterward, she competed for the Certified Master Baker exam, "a grueling two-day, 14-hour test of skills, time management and artistry," as Moore describes it. To prepare for it, she spent several months baking cookies, quick breads, challah, croissants and more while on the clock. She also had to decorate a cake and do a

six-minute split, fill and ice of a cake in one take.

Moore's advice, "Don't overthink too much. That was my biggest mistake. More than once my colleagues had to remind me to stop overthinking and to go with my gut and stick to the fundamentals."

Guiding the next generation

Moore has taught at Schoolcraft's Culinary Arts Department for the past 10 years. She teaches baking, food chemistry and manages four cafés at Schoolcraft.

Moore's commitment wasn't the only thing that kept her going: she wanted to set an example to the female students and prove that women chefs can pursue that same standard of excellence.

She wanted to do what she did to set a good example for her daughter, whom she describes as "a huge driving force" behind her going the distance and achieving her dream.

A network of support

Before becoming an instructor here, Moore was the student. She is a graduate of the Culinary Arts program. Her first impressions of the program she described were exciting, new and a little bit intimidating. She had never worked in a professional kitchen before starting the program, but before long the other students became her second family. Moore approached Schoolcraft's famous Culinary Arts program and rose to stunning heights, inspired by all of her

colleagues, instructors and family along the way.

The constant pursuit of excellence that Schoolcraft's four master chefs commit to their craft and better themselves is the dominant culture of Culinary Arts.

Moore had established quite the support system throughout her culinary journey to master baker. Chef Jeffrey Gabriel, Certified Master Chef, Chef Joseph Decker, Certified Master Pastry Chef and Chef Shawn Loving, Certified Master Chef were key ingredients to her success.

Gabriel was her baking instructor, describing him thusly: "He totally lit my fire for the passion of baking [and] taught me the fundamentals of the craft and his help was immeasurable during my preparations for the [baking] exam," as well as providing mentorship and support throughout her career, adding a dash of humor during tough times.

Moore was an apprentice to Decker right out of culinary school, who mentored and provided countless opportunities throughout her career.

Loving provided a source of encouragement and support to Moore by providing opportunities and resources she needed to succeed in her Master Baker exam.

When asked about the next five years, Moore responded that she's "hoping to be here at Schoolcraft teaching the next generation of future bakers and possibly participating in competitions."

Having mastered the craft of baking, Moore isn't slowing down. Students enrolled in the program

During her time pursuing the certification of master baker this past spring, she set a good example to her students, getting them excited and proving to them, in her own words that "they're never done learning" and that "even instructors are still doing things to make themselves better." They can look no further than Heather Moore as an inspiration and keep pursuing their dreams.

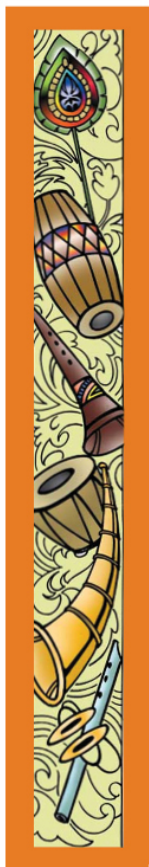

In the past, trainees had to travel to four different training sites across Metro Detroit. Now, they can receive all of their training at one location at the Public Safety Training Complex (PSTC) and Firearms Training Center located on 31775 Industrial Road, just southwest of the intersection at I-96 and Merriman, only a few minutes east of I-96 and I-275.

This complex consists of four main buildings, the Academy Training Center (ATC), Firearms Training Center (FTC), the Driving Pad and the Fire Tower.

Trainees don't just come from across the state of Michigan either.

The complex fits so many needs and offers so many programs that states across the union send their men and women to train here. This makes PSTC a centralized location where a winning combination of quality staff and state-of-the-art facilities offers training across multiple areas of public safety.

Over the years, Associate Dean

Gerald Champagne and his colleagues at PSTC have built a lot of healthy relationships with branches of law enforcement across the country, particularly with federal agencies such as the FBI, the Secret Service and the Department of Homeland Security. They have used these relationships to train large numbers of their agents at the Complex, using state-of-the-art programs and research into the general trends of crime across the U.S. to ensure that their training needs are met.

Take, for instance, the Academy Training Center's Maze Room. It's a large room, one out of only 16 in the U.S., containing 120 movable walls that can be configured to resemble a bank to simulate a bank robbery, a hallway with multiple classrooms to prepare for a school shooting, a house to train for home invasion situations and much more.

This is used for realistic training sessions by all law enforcement trainees at the complex and the instructors are state and local police officers who have dedicated their service and experience toward

making trainees into the best public servants they can be.

The ATC also includes the firearms training center, complete with a regular firing range, tactical firing range and the Firearms Safety Training (FaST) Room. The first is a state-of-the-art room with advanced air-filtration systems that remove the lead given off by firearms discharged on the range, making it among the best firearm ranges in the U.S. The latter room is where trainees are tasked with learning foresight and split-second decision-making techniques during scenarios whether or not to shoot, using prop guns that fire lasers.

Another room at the ATC is the Multipurpose Training Room, a room large enough to comfortably fit several police cars. It's used for physical fitness and various other levels of training, up to traffic stop simulations and rescue operations, weather not permitting. Adjacent to the ATC is the Training Pad, an 10-acre obstruction-free tarmac used in pursuit vehicle training and outdoor traffic stop and arrest simulations, as well as mannequins planted inside of cars to recreate a rescue operation where they need to take victims to a hospital.

Schoolcraft's PSTC has attracted talent from across the entire country. Agents from the Social Security Administration just recently sent agents from across three states in the Midwest: Michigan, Indiana and Ohio. In addition, 14 police officers recently graduated from a basic SWAT school and a two-week Evidence Technician School graduated 14 officers from agencies across the Detroit Metro area.

The Public Safety community makes good use of Schoolcraft's Public Safety Training Complex and the college is ready to train the heroes of tomorrow who dedicate their lives to justice and helping people in need.

Further changes to the AS building will include the implementation of more glass throughout building which will be done for two purposes. The first allows for the students walking through the hallways to see what is happening inside the classrooms. The second is a marketing technique which will promote and market the programs held inside. Lastly, changes being made to the Applied Science building will have an ambulatory bay within the classroom, allowing the ambulance to back into the classroom, giving the students practical experiences to prepare them for the profession.

Expansion of the Nursing and medical programs means that the skilled trade professions would need to relocate.

Schoolcraft has purchased a warehouse which is located off campus, adjacent to the Public Safety facility and will house those skilled trade professions being relocated from the Applied Sciences building.

“Welding, computer labs and heavy lifting skilled trade from Applied Science building which will be offered twice as much space as currently provided,” states Jeffress.

Moreover, Jeffress addressed the more practical changes coming to the Fitness Center at the request of St. Joe’s stating, “St. Joe’s wanted to add a facility which allowed for PT type training and a number of other physical activities.”

Inside changes are to include tennis courts and a multipurpose space, in addition to space for Fitness Leadership and Mercy Elite.

Lastly, Jeffress refers to the new medical building which will be

located on the northeast quadrant of the campus, adjacent to I-275, just north of the St. Joe’s Sports Dome. “It will be named the Schoolcraft Medical Center,” states Jeffress. “We would like to include the Nursing and OR techs, the MRI

techs and also CT scan techs.”

Initial groundbreaking is scheduled to begin in October 2019 and students, faculty, staff and visitors are encouraged to be mindful as to where they are able to park.


services like psychotherapy, nursing and case management.

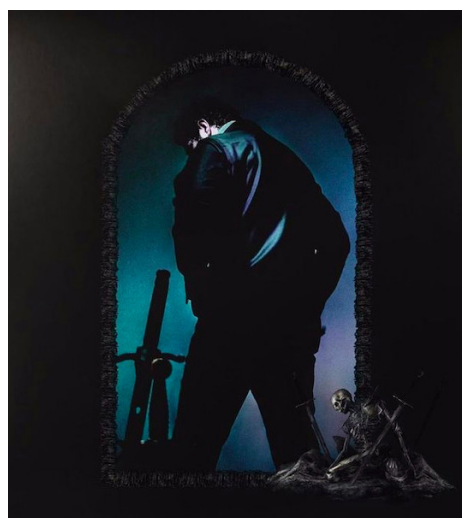

After the release of his 2018 sophomore album “Beerbongs & Bentleys,” lyricist/vocalist Post Malone is back with his third studio LP and arguably his best project to date, “Hollywood's Bleeding.”

Unlike any other artist of today's

generation, what makes Post Malone stand out from the competition comes from, not just being able to blend in with his peers sonically, but rather his innate ability to combine/utilize different genres within his music.

If one were to try and label Post Malone's music, there wouldn't be just one.

Post Malone isn't just rap, pop, rock or country - he's all of the above, and “Hollywood's Bleeding” proves and supplies listeners with an experience as such.

Compared to his previous projects “Stoney” and “Beerbongs & Bentleys”, “Hollywood's Bleeding” finds Post Malone in a more emotional/darker state, which is matched along with the usual musical cadence. On the opening track “Hollywood's Bleeding” Post Malone is in a state of reflection, where he is talking about how toxic the Hollywood lifestyle can be. He even goes as far to even comparing the lifestyle to that of a vampire and how it can “suck the blood” of out oneself, meaning that it can drain the life out of you. This can even be interpolated as to how people who live in Hollywood feed on the lives of other individuals, especially on those with a rather popular/wealthy status in the Hollywood/media industry.

The intro to the album completely sets the tone for the entirety of the album. With songs like “Saint-Tropez” and “Enemies feat DaBaby” discussing topics such

as the lavish lifestyle Post Malone is living (Saint-Tropez). While on “Enemies”, Posty raps over a trap beat, introspectively discussing how his fame and fortune have affected his relationships. The Chorus simply speaks for itself. “Used to have friends now I have enemies; Used keep ‘em close now they dead to me.”

“Hollywood's Bleeding” boasts an impressive list of star-studded features all of which range from different genres in music, helping complete and showcase Post Malone's talent. “Die for Me” feat. Future and Halsey, “Take What You

Want” feat. Ozzie Osbourne and Travis Scott, “On the Road” feat. Meek Mill and Lil Baby plus more, all add value and are not wasted whatsoever.

“Hollywood's Bleeding” is a project that not only showcases Young Stoney's skills as a hip-hop artist or pop artist, but just as an artist period, all while showcasing a rather more emotional side that hasn't been heard from Post Malone before.”

Overall, “Hollywood's Bleeding” is a project that blends rap, trap, country and rock all together tastefully without trying too hard.

La Havas' latest album tells a story of coming of age and finding one's roots

necessarily where they were born, but where their family originated from, so many generations ago. Not many have a chance to find that out for themselves, though the velvet-voiced Lianne La Havas did just that.

She and her mother flew from Havas' home country of England to Jamaica, the land of her matrilineal heritage; this journey is what her album "Blood" sprouted from. This album is a colorful musical collage, ranging from powerful, inertia-filled songs like "Unstoppable" to the molasses melancholy of serenades such as "Wonderful," and they all are born from two interwoven stories; the aforementioned trip to Jamaica and the emotional quandary of Havas' revived romance.

Of the songs that imbue her Jamaican lineage to the listener, it would be without a doubt "Green and Gold"; the keen-eyed would notice that even the name of the song is evocative of the Jamaican flag. It opens with imagery of Havas looking at herself in the mirror as a child, pondering her identity: "Six years old / Starin' at my nose in the mirror / Trying to dip my toes in the mirror / Thinkin' 'Who's that girl?' / and 'Does the mirror world go on forever?'"

It goes on about her evolution as a young woman, with the chorus focusing on her chase of the "green and gold," using "Those eyes you gave to me / To let me see / Where I come from." She even gives a little nod to Greece with the line "Just

like the ancient stone," as that is where her father's side of the family originated.

As for the relationship oriented portion of the album, it is a rather conflicted and melancholy narrative; though not quite in chronological order. It's a story of her getting back together with someone after a breakup, but it seems nearly backward, with songs of the "Unstoppable" confidence that oozes out of any reunited couple coming in at the beginning, with somber songs of the initial "Good Goodbye" right at the end.

Altogether, "Blood" is a masterful collection of colorful artistry with a song for any mood; definitely worth a listen from anyone who are looking to expand their horizons.

The tale of cruel affections

An eerily common tale of false love, abuse and a tragic, bitter end

This subject is more commonly expressed through film and book and - of course - music. Take, for instance, Billie Eilish's newest album, "When We All Fall Asleep, Where Do We Go?," which tells a master crafted story of how poisonous a toxic personality can really be, complete with plot and characters, woven all throughout.

The album first introduces the "bad guy" character who nurtures pain in the one who can safely be referred to as Eilish. He - assuming he's male - is most forwardly characterized in his own perspective through the songs "Bad Guy" and "You Should See Me in a Crown," both of which are full of egotism and bombast galore, coloring him as someone who's only after what selfish pleasures the fancy the most. This man is the Abuser, the

Antagonist; the one who uses his victim as simply a mean to his own end. The entire album uses a bit of voice augmentation to differentiate who is speaking, the Abuser or the Victim.

Shortly after the introduction of the "bad guy," is the introduction of the "good girl"; the innocent, the victim. "All the Good Girls Go to Hell" introduces the victim. However, on its own, the song is about climate change, but when placed as a part of this narrative, it takes on a different purpose.

The victim is characterized as desiring change in her relationship with her abuser, as in "Wish You Were Gay." She is characterized as being unable to leave, as she's addicted to the cruel love she's given, as in "My Strange Addiction." It is revealed that she lost so much

as a result of the relationship, especially friends - whether figuratively or literally - as in "bury a friend." Most importantly, this relationship has eroded so much of her mental health away that it has driven her to suicide, as heard in "Listen before I go."

Eilish herself confirmed in an MTV interview, "It just kind of dies down and it feels like it's a goodbye. It almost feels like an RIP."

Altogether, "When We All Fall Asleep, Where Do We Go?" is an album about as warm and cozy as a rusty knife on a half rotten workbench in a half-rotten derelict barn - and while that probably is the intended taste of this particular bag of apples, Eilish had earned herself a subjective rating of 7/10 bad guys. These apples are just a tad too sour.

Dear Doubtful Student,
Here at the Writing Support Studio we often refer to writing as being a game of ideas. With writing, it is the student who is doing the coding for that game and its rules. It is the student who is deciding how ideas interact and what they ultimately mean and will do in the world. There is no equation to work within, and there are no rules for idea construction other than those guidelines set forth by the prompt. One will find that those rules are typically looser than they may have initially suspected. Though this burden of crafting ideas and deciding what they mean is a great responsibility, it is also a great opportunity.

The less stringent nature of writing, which is indicative of its subjective nature as a discipline, means that there is always room for growth. There is always punctuation that could have been more effectively placed in correlation with a work's tone. There is always more appropriate diction that could have been utilized for the purpose of conveying meaning within the work. Ultimately, there is always a connection, whether it be technical or intellectual, that has been left unmade. Despite the fact that as a writer it can be difficult to determine where one's responsibilities end, and at times even where they begin, the essence of writing is the interaction of ideas coming together to form a unified machine. There is power in being able to convey thought preparedly. While ideas can be connected, the manner in which they have been and whether or not a writer

has achieved perfection can always be debated. Ernest Hemingway once suggested that "We are all apprentices in a craft where no one ever becomes a master." At the Writing Support Studio, we do not believe that there was ever a sentence that has been crafted concerning writing that is more truthful. This is because there is no fine-woven metric for perfection. There is no way to prove that a work could not have been more effective in a particular regard or perhaps bolder regarding topics that have been included yet not capitalized on. However, a writer can rest assured that they belong to a community that treasures all ideas and is devoted to understanding. Writing is a tool for self-development and coming to a further understanding of one's own self. It is academic, and it is more than academic. Works of writing are places where a snapshot of reality can be captured, but it is

important to remember that there is always more to learn. This is not a negative thing; rather, it implies endless opportunity in a world where it may feel as though much of what is important has already been discovered. Society has only scraped the surface, and in life individuals rarely do more than scrape the surface. If one is using study strategies that have been effective for English classes, perhaps they are not using a strategy that may be even more effective for them. Perhaps they have not been introduced to a strategy that will work well in tandem with the strategies that they already employ. If one is achieving high grades and yet continuing the use of a pattern that is hindering them from excellence, perhaps a dedicated peer review will be useful in achieving such excellence. One's limits as a writer are precisely what they decide them to be.

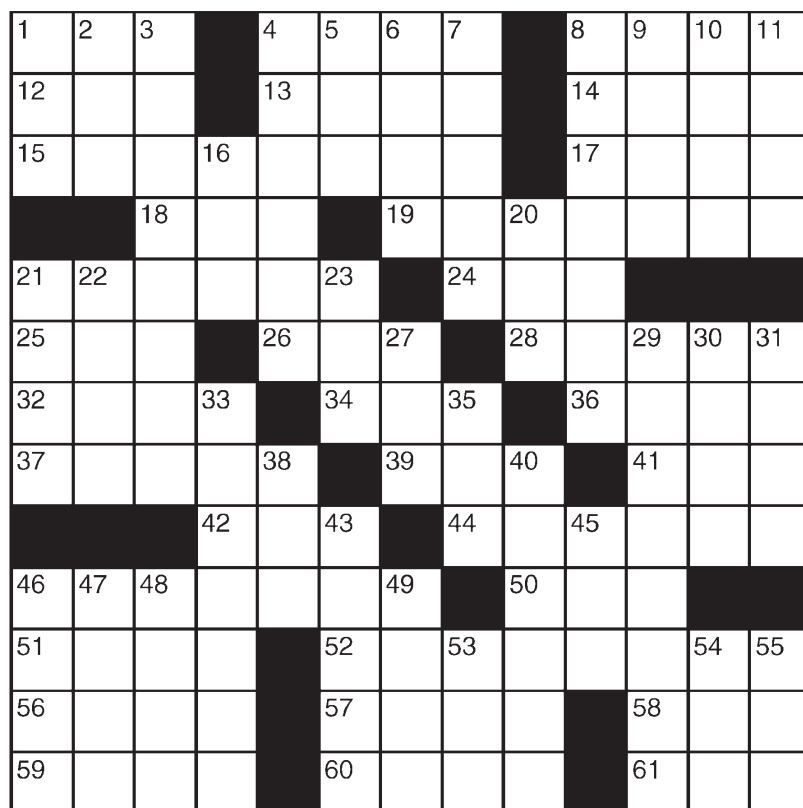

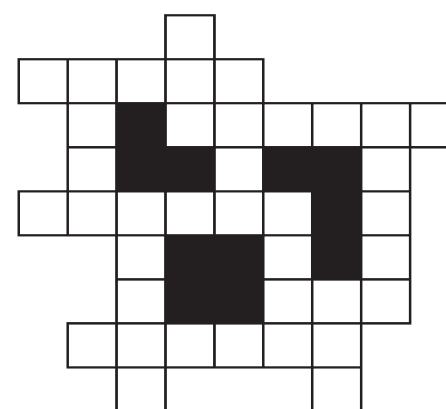
