Each New Year's Day, the world tunes into the iconic Rose Parade in Pasadena, California prior to the Rose Bowl game. Known officially as the Tournament of Roses Parade, this annual celebration features large elaborate floral floats, celebrities, equestrian units and musical performances by marching bands from all over the country.

This year a familiar face took part in the festivities. The Craft Grille manager Jeff Groth, was selected to participate as a member of the Band Directors Marching Band, a group of hundreds of current and former school band directors. Prior to his role on campus Groth was heavily involved in music education. Groth originally started as a junior high school band director at Macomb County for 30 years. Groth plays many instruments, such as the clarinet, saxophone and some brass instruments to name a few. With his arsenal he played in the Rose Bowl parade twice and the Macy's day

parade once with this same group.

Groth had a lengthy process to endure to be selected.

First performers needed to send in a lengthy application with videos of their previous marching band experience. Groth explains that they are extremely strict about the small details when reviewing these performances, looking at things like spacing, rank and file while determining if the performer is fit for their band or not.

This process takes six months before applicants are notified of selection. After being accepted, individuals will have to send in a recording to audition for their instrument. This has a quicker turnaround time, with individuals only having to wait about 2 weeks.

Groth submitted his first application for the group in 2022, which was his first

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Rose Parade. He says that the following applications are much easier after you've done a performance or two with them. "You're kind of grandfathered in now after you've already done it three times now," said Groth.

Only a few people have come back as much as he has though. Out of the over 300 members, only 26 people have come back for all three parades. This year, there were a lot of new individuals who joined Groth.

The band accepts people from all different backgrounds. The youngest in the band was 19, while the oldest was in their 80s. There were also people not only from all 50 states, but also those from Japan, Germany and Mexico.

What keeps this show running is the practice that each individual puts into their own music and performance and Groth really took this to heart. Not only did he practice for over 40 hours in preparation, he also would memorize the music so well he could write it down from memory. "I just got to the point where I would actually write out the manuscript of the music on manuscript paper, which helps you memorize things as well. Once I was able to write it out and play through it, then I was good," said Groth.

In order to prepare, Groth not only played his music but also got up his physical stamina. He would walk his dog and also walk on his treadmill at his house. While he was using the treadmill, he would also play his instrument to really get a good feel for what it would be like on the day of.

Groth suggests individuals to practice both indoors and outdoors to experience the differing weather conditions and get used to the potential harsh conditions.

While most of the practicing is done on the individual's own time, performers needed to memorize all their music for the five mile long parade less than a week prior to the event. The group finally met up for the first time on the Sunday before the parade, only five days before the performance took place.

Each practice was for two hours from 7

to 9 p.m., but since the director of the band decided to also add in a jazz and concert band component, Groth also needed to practice from 9:30 pm to 11:30 p.m.

Along with practicing the music for the first time as a group, they also needed to practice the 110 degree turn that they would have to make to enter the five and a half mile stretch. Most bands only need to make a 90 degree turn at most, so this can be extremely difficult to stay in form and unified throughout the entire turn.

Groth explained that this was also the point they chose to start the recording, so they had to get it right. However, this would be the least of their worries. After they make that turn, the band will have to play for two and a half miles, continuously. This can be extremely difficult because of how much they have to manage at once. They have to make sure they stay in line with everyone else, staying parallel with both the people in front of them as well as those

beside them. They also have to focus on playing and maintaining their breath while marching.

Two miles might not seem like a lot, but for those marching, it can feel like eternity and after entering the parade, individuals are not allowed to leave. Of course if there is an emergency, like getting overheated on the big day people can step out, however they will not be allowed back into the formation. Before starting, they had to be sure they could make it the whole way through.

When asking Groth about any advice he has to give to people who want to perform in the Rose Bowl Parade, he said to set goals.

"You have to have a goal, plan for it and be the leader. Go out there and tell people we need to try this," said Groth.

Sweet Success

Chef Amy Knowles awarded 2025 MI Pastry Chef of the Year

From delicate French pastries to towering showpieces, Schoolcraft Culinary Arts instructor Chef Amy Knowles has spent over two decades perfecting her craft, earning her a reputation for precision, originality and technical mastery. Knowles has built a career grounded in precision and ingenuity, and each recognition reflects her dedication to craftsmanship and the pursuit of perfection in each creation.

These skills have earned her the prestigious title of Michigan Pastry Chef of the Year 2025, one of many impressive titles under her belt, which include the Culinary Arts Award of Excellence from Macomb Community College, the Golden Medallion Award and the American Academy of Chefs' Scholarship.

This honor is awarded through the Michigan Chefs de Cuisine Association, recognizing outstanding pastry chefs for excellence in creativity, flavor and presentation. Nominees are evaluated by a panel of certified chefs based on professional achievements, contributions to the culinary field and demonstrated mastery in pastry arts in live competitions against two other competitors, with the winner being announced at the awards dinner a few months later.

Her work over the years at the Country Club of Detroit as a lead in pastry operations, the Schoolcraft culinary program and her own boutique company exemplifies her work ethic and consistency. She is known for her attention to detail and ability to elevate performance through example and encouragement.

Knowles's love for pastry and culinary arts has always been embedded in her from an early age and roots in resounding family traditions. When asked who her greatest influence was, she expressed that her great-grandmother played a pivotal role in shaping her approach in the kitchen and instigating a love for both creativity and the culinary arts.

"She was the first person who brought it

home," said Knowles. Going on to express that her style and work have, over time, also been influenced by the people she has worked with, and by meeting new and interesting people and getting to know their styles and techniques.

As a child, Knowles loved experimenting with "whatever ingredients were available in the pantry," crafting sweets, pastries, and desserts in inventive ways. Those early experiments have helped develop the creativity, intuition, and problem-solving skills that now define her professional approach.

While it's indefinite whether she plans to compete again in the future, Knowles is currently focused on teaching and mentoring the next generation of pastry chefs. For Amy, mentorship is not just about teaching technical skills, but also about helping students build confidence, solidity, and imagination in the kitchen. Her approach encourages young chefs to embrace mistakes as part of the learning

process.

"The advice I give to all students is to trust yourself and always give yourself a little grace," said Knowles. She emphasizes that it's all part of the learning process and one should nurture their individual style and passion.

Though she specializes in French pastries and sweet goods, Knowles believes that with food there is a constant evolution of flavor and technique, one that should be encouraged and sought out, and thus is always finding new ways to elevate a recipe.

Knowles's success lies not only in her technical expertise but also in her ability to connect with people, whether it be colleagues, clients, or students. She believes that culinary excellence comes from a mix of hard work, curiosity, and an openness to learning from others. Her humility and dedication make her both a role model and a source of inspiration for aspiring chefs.

Globalizing the classroom

Psychology professor encourage students to broaden their world views

One conversation with Psychology professor Colleen Pilgrim and anyone can see her passion and dedication to understanding global societies from a psychological perspective is very apparent.

Pilgrim's love for psychology began with her intrigue in a science that dealt with researching human behavior and the puzzle aspect of it, which ultimately led her to becoming a social and developmental psychologist by training.

The walls in her office stand as testament to her interest in traveling for cross-cultural work and research; adorned with pictures from different countries.

Pilgrim's research strongly influences her teachings at Schoolcraft. Her course on social psychology incorporates cross-cultural research and the SCHEMA framework which examines human behavior, their biases and how an individual cognitively sees the world; highlighting how these perceptions differ due to culture and environment.

Pilgrim strives to bring her global knowledge and research to campus; for this reason, her research on Pol Pot and the genocide is a part of her curriculum.

In addition to discussing the Cambodian genocide through the Loung Ung's "First They Killed My Father" and her own research, her class applies a psychological framework on genocide and how the same social factors facilitate genocide. According to her, what keeps her passionate is bringing global focus into the classroom.

While Pilgrim worked as a research

investigator at University of Michigan early in her career, she longed to return to the classroom. While she jokingly remarked that she became a professor because she never wanted to leave school, what inspired her to come to Schoolcraft was its relatively large population of first generation college students, something that resonated with her as a first generation college graduate herself.

"My job is awesome, I get paid to learn and to share that knowledge with students," said Pilgrim when asked what inspired her to become a professor.

As a member of the International Students Center at Schoolcraft and having researched cross-cultural social psychology since her

junior year of undergrad at Michigan State University, Pilgrim understands that every student comes to the classroom with different perspectives. For this reason, she has always prioritized developing new ideas and approaches to teaching.

She hopes that, in addition to the scientific methodology and processes, her students also learn the ability to expand their SCHEMA's and be able to understand the world beyond the view they first entered the classroom with. It is clear that professor Pilgrim wants her students to gain more than just the content outlined in

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her syllabus.

Pilgrim urges students to consider the practicality of the psychological field, encouraging them to pursue graduate schools and exploring the different avenues within the field.

According to her, psychology is present in nearly all disciplines. However, Pilgrim emphasized that what unites all these fields is the methodology and their commitment towards trying to understand human behavior.

She believes psychology to be a vast and interesting field, one that she hopes inspires her students to become more empathetic towards other people.

Professor Colleen Pilgrim is a well-rounded professor who in addition to being dedicated to her field is also committed to giving her students a deeper understanding of the world they live in and the environment that shapes them.

Students interested in psychology should consider taking Professor Colleen Pilgrim’s Introduction to Psychology (Psych 201), Social Psychology (Psych 207), Life Span Developmental Psychology (Psych 229) or Abnormal Psychology (Psych 239).

"So, I figured I'd give it a shot... I was also having a really hard time thinking 'oh,

Although he enjoys tutoring, Alnakhala's main focus is pursuing his career. He's working towards a bachelor's degree in electrical engineering, and wants to work in the industry after graduating. Thanks to Schoolcraft's attention to community, Alnakhala became not just a Student Employee but an important and impactful member of a community of students.

"[Tutoring] made me realize there's nothing wrong with asking questions. I thought about how hundreds of students come into the tutoring center, and it made me realize that there's nothing wrong with that," said Alnakhala.

A3 Engineering Club Takes Flight with Student Built R/C Plane

“Holy cow, how is that thing flying — we really did that,” said Tobi Lile, president of the A3 Engineering club, after the successful launch of the group’s student-built, 5-foot long, R/C (radio controlled) airplane. The flight marked the accomplishment of months of hard work, becoming the club’s most complex build to date.

The A3 Engineering club (short for Aviation, Aerospace and Aeronautics Engineering), brings together students interested in aviation design and engineering. This year’s work introduced members to new challenges and deeper problem-solving, highlighting the club’s continuous growth in both skill and ambition.

Whether for future goals or mere enjoyment,

the club gives members practical experience in building aircraft models from scratch. Being a part of this team shows students what the engineering field is like, teaching them the importance of starting from the beginning, making mistakes and advancing through hard work.

Lile first proposed the idea of building an R/C plane because he wanted the club to start strong and give members a meaningful opportunity for future engineering pursuits. Vice presidents Hanz Saleem and Faizan Khurran immediately supported the idea, and on Oct. 16, 2025, the team began drafting the initial plans for the project.

“We struggled along the way, but we overcame issues and we ended up with a

finalized project,” Saleem said. Lile added that “facing failure and not having an equation to fall back on” was one of the most valuable parts of the engineering experience.

From there, the team began the long process of designing, cutting and assembling each part of the plane. Members worked on Computer-Aided Design software to modify components and adjust a 3D model of the plane. With guidance from R/C mentor Bob McDonald, the team leaders moved into the physical construction, using the necessary tools, machines, and blueprints to bring the aircraft to life.

“Our first week and a half into winter break, we spent about 50 hours building the plane at Bob’s house,” vice president Saleem said. With McDonald helping them through each step, the team spent hours measuring parts, calculating angles and testing fits as they tried to piece each component together.

The wing was the first component the team built, and it had to be the right weight and size for the plane to fly. Saleem explained taking measurements was the most difficult part of the process, and without McDonald’s experience and tools, the task would’ve been even harder. President Lile described the challenges as “chain reactions” — if the weight or measurement of one piece was off, it would throw off the next, ultimately affecting the plane’s ability to fly.

Away from the construction, vice president Khurran said that teamwork was its own challenge. After realizing that meeting once a week wasn’t enough to complete the project, he felt that “it was a lot more time-consuming than we initially thought.”

The team also disagreed on the plane’s colors and final design, a small but significant example of how every decision needed compromise

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before the finishing touches. Even with the long hours and constant adjusting, the leaders said it was draining at times but worth it in the end.

On the morning of Jan. 10, 2026, the plane was tested and successfully launched at the Signal Seekers R/C Club field. Saleem said he "felt complete," as it was a major accomplishment to see the plane in the air. Khurran was excited to finally fly it, while Lile was impressed with how perfectly it performed and even got a video of it upside down and flying.

For the club's leaders, the project was as much about guiding a team as it was about building a plane. The president said, "You really have to forget your opinions for a second...understand where they're coming from, and from there you can meet in the middle." They gave members as many opportunities as possible to contribute to the design and structure, even when limited space

meant not everyone could work on the build at the same time.

Beyond teamwork, each member took away something different from the project. Vice president Hanz Saleem, who didn't have much prior leadership experience, said the project helped him understand how to lead moving forward. Faizan Khurran added that learning to talk to people and take initiative is just as important as the technical work. President Tobi Lile highlighted the shift in his point of view of ownership that comes with leading a group, saying, "there's no I in team."

Each leader also had their own piece of advice to share with future builders and club members. Saleem emphasized using struggles and setbacks as opportunities to persevere and problem-solve, while Khurran reiterated his mentor's advice by encouraging students to help and learn from one another. Lile simply advised students to work hard and stay curious.

With the project complete, the club leaders are already discussing what comes next.

There has been talk of building a rocket

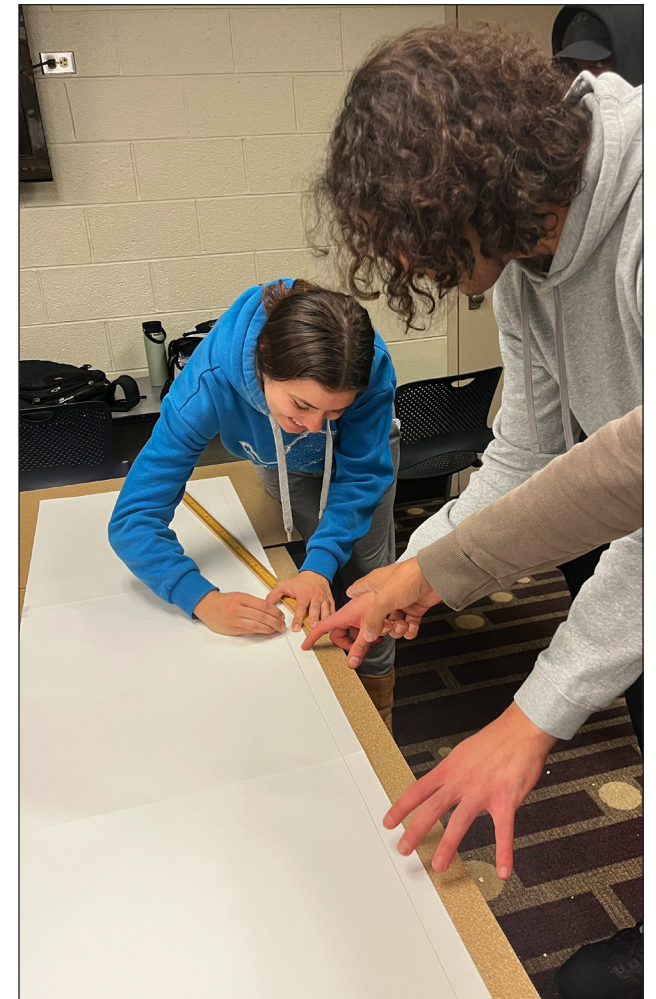
or a drone, though the next project is still undecided. As they prepare to transfer out of Schoolcraft, they hope more students will step into leadership roles and continue to offer hands-on approaches to engineering.

What began as a single plane has opened doors, from internship opportunities to the chance to present their work to the president and board of directors of Boeing, and created a path for future students to build, lead and discover opportunities of their own.

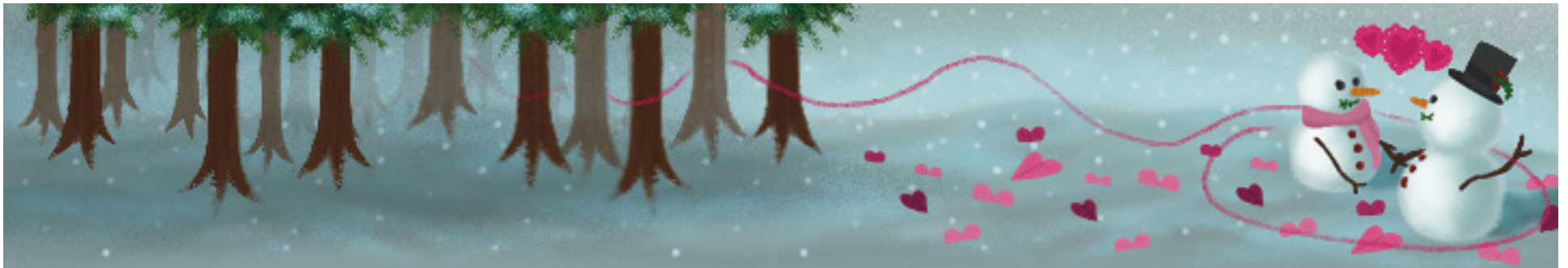

Just Another Zombie Movie, Or A Unique Take on The Genre? The Gift That Keeps On Giving

Stories of undead masses causing an apocalypse have been around for millennia. Though the classic cannibalistic zombie we know and love on screen has only existed since the late 1960s. “28 Years Later: The Bone Temple” is the fourth installment in a series that took vastly new approaches to other zombie movies. The original film, “28 Days Later (2003),” replaced the slow, mindless ghouls with fast, aggressive, infected people. Instead of being the undead, the monsters were alive, driven by a need to spread the virus, and capable of dying.

“The Bone Temple,” directed by Nia DaCosta, features familiar names like Ralph Fiennes, Jack O’Connell and Cillian Murphy. Unlike the previous movies, we follow the same characters in “28 Years Later (2025),” rather than a completely different group of people. Those being Spike (Alfie Williams), Samson (Chi Lewis-Parry), Dr. Ian Kelson (Ralph Fiennes) and Jimmy Crystal (Jack O’Connell). Each actor, big and not, did a fantastic job at portraying the most primitive human emotions and instinctual reactions to the harsh conditions of an apocalypse.

The film was amazing from the get-go.

The soundtrack was phenomenal, with popular songs like “Ordinary World” (Duran Duran), “Everything in Its Right Place” (Radiohead) and “The Number of the Beast” (Iron Maiden).

The cinematography was reminiscent of past films while still being unique in its own right; especially when it gets somewhat “crusty,” follows specific characters, or becomes cloudy and dreamlike. Intense moments are enhanced and exaggerated by the shaky, jolting camera movements as they follow characters. In addition with the outright nudity and unabashed gore, it makes for a coldly horrifying

experience. Unlike the other movies, it’s not all doom and gloom either. It shows both evil and monstrosity in the form of Jimmy’s cult and the opposite. That being the goodness and humanity.

The gore was everything it needed to be and more. Heads being ripped out of the body with the spine still attached, monuments of femurs and skulls, intestines strewn around and skin being peeled off living muscle are done flawlessly.

“The Bone Temple” differs from other movies in that respect, as sometimes the gore can be overdone and tacky. The infected look disgusting, covered in blood, vomit and other bodily fluids. Combined with hemorrhaged eyes, vicious attitudes and a relentless search for new blood, it forces fear into the audience.

The entire movie was tense, living is never a guarantee, and as shown before, it can change in an instant.

At about the halfway point, a pregnant woman, Cathy, and her husband, Tom, lose a man to the infected while coming home from the woods. They get back to their fenced-in “compound” they share with another couple and an old man, only to find Jimmy and his cult have forced their way in. The cult forces the survivors to feed them, before Cathy insists they leave, and the Jimmys attack. They are then skinned alive, called “charity” by Jimmy Crystal, before the whole barn is set aflame by Tom in an effort to kill the Jimmys.

A driving point in each of the “28 Days Later” movies is that nothing is constant, everything changes and everything dies. Horror series that have been going on for a while can lose the plot and the later installments are left a shell of what they could’ve been. The theme of “memento mori” is clear and carried

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throughout "The Bone Temple" without being overbearing or too focused on the past films.

There wasn't one scene that fell short or ruined any scenes. The entire thing was wonderful, top to bottom, though it's always a disappointment when a beloved character dies unnecessarily. Some of the best moments include those between Dr. Kelson and Samson, Spike with the Jimmys, and when Jim, the protagonist in the original film, is featured.

A Corgi Possession that was all bark, no bite

Knock-Knock. Who's there? A comedy book that lacks the punchline.

Sara Levine's, "The Hitch" is about an insufferable aunt, Rose, who insists on taking care of her six year old nephew Nathan while his parents are going on trip to Mexico. During this week however, disaster strikes. While out in the park, Rose's dog Walter attacks another dog, killing her. The dog's soul then jumps for the body of the dog into Nathan.

What was proposed as a comedy has readers rolling their eyes more often than laughing out loud.

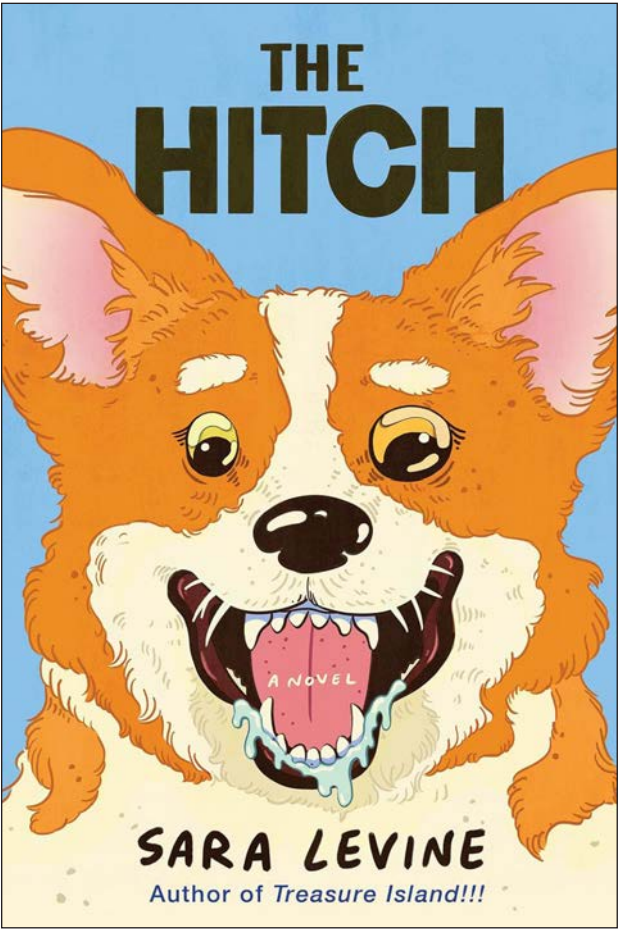
satire or not because none of the characters juxtaposed her. Most of the characters were overdramatic stereotypes of their archetype that felt flat and quite frankly, underdeveloped.

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messes up after just one week of babysitting.

It's not just the readers who find her insufferable though. The other characters in the book also find her absolutely frustrating.

She is constantly messing up with her family, friends and coworkers, seemingly doing nothing right while thinking she is completely justified in what she says and does.

While this may work in other books, that is usually because this character trope is a side character, has another character to balance them out or has a redemption arc. Without any of these elements, it feels needlessly exhausting listening to her.

While she does have a half hearted attempt at realizing that she might be the issue, she never fully changed. Instead of showing growth in the character, the author tried to make the readers feel empathetic towards her by pointing out how lonely she was even though this loneliness stems from her stubbornness and inability to see her own flaws. This isn't a wacky character that needs to find the right people to be around, she is a flawed person who needs to realize that she is pushing away everyone around her. She doesn't even start to realize this until page 200 out of 289.

She isn't the only flaw though.

Sara Levine makes all her characters these one dimensional people. Nathan's father is the peace keeper who when he is around will go with anything anyone says. Nathan's mother is over-bearing. Omar, her best friend, is the therapist's friend, always blaming everything on trauma and obsessed with saying he is the listening ear. But they don't go deeper than that.

When Rose yelled at Omar and blamed him for the scuba diving accident, he showed up by her side completely fine, not even expecting an apology. There should have been some lingering tension or there should have been a deeper talk about how he was being treated. Instead the scene was short and the issue was chalked up to just Rose being Rose. That would work if it was a lighthearted jest that was a little rough, but that's not what it was. She made a targeted

remark even though she knew that it wasn't true. She genuinely is a bad person and the fact that her best friend blew it off without even addressing the issues they clearly have is poor writing.

Then there is the corgi. The book easily could have done well without the idea that a corgi possessed the little boy. Hazel, the dog, didn't even play a real role in anything other than telling puns and knock-knock jokes and turning into the dog a few times. The dog had no real role in this book and merely complicated the plot further.

If Rose was taking care of Nathan and realized through this week her flaws then striving to get better, it could have been a good book. The corgi was merely a pull to the book because people enjoy that dog.

Levine is struggling to decide between a supernatural book and a slice-of-life family book, which did not play out in her favor. There is simply too much going on to make this book enjoyable, which is why the characters are underdeveloped and flat.

This book also reads more like this happens, then this happens, then this happens.

It's not an actual story, it is a retelling of imaginary events.

There is no point to the book.

The reader does not learn anything from the characters nor is it funny enough to say it is for pure enjoyment.

Finding Balance: The Art of Managing it All

Understanding what life is like as a student-athlete

At 5:30 a.m., while the Schoolcraft campus buildings are still quiet and most students have hours of sleep ahead of them, many athletes are already facing their first battle of the day: the comfort of their beds. This is the daily reality for volleyball player Hayden Brose, whose day begins long before the sun rises. There is no time for negotiations with the subconscious. The pace is intense, and her first commitment, team practice, demands high energy from the very first hour.

Nutrition is the foundation of this routine. Each athlete follows different habits to stay energized until their next meal. To fuel her demanding schedule, bowler Olivia Lambert takes extra care with her morning meal, preparing rice and eggs at 6 a.m. This breakfast gives her the stamina to meet the demands of her day.

However, a strict early-morning routine isn't the only path to success. Some athletes, like Cross Country runner Matthew Saval, find their rhythm later in the day. Whether an athlete is an early bird or a night owl, the priority remains the same, understanding the crucial need for recovery and sleep to face another grueling day of training.

Regardless of how their mornings begin, these athletes represent Schoolcraft College in blue and gold, competing throughout Michigan and on the national stage. Yet, their toughest opponent isn't always the team in the other uniform, it's the clock. With non-negotiable schedules for training, classes, and games, every extra minute is valuable. Balancing this lifestyle requires constant sacrifice, what economics professors conceptualize as "opportunity cost."

In the life of an Ocelot, every hour comes with a price. Choosing an extra hour at the gym might mean sacrificing an hour of studying for a math exam. A week of intense training must be balanced by a weekend spent in front of books and computers. It is a constant game of give-and-take, where everyone knows that excelling on the field means nothing if it is not accompanied by academic success.

Beyond the Scoreboard

In the world of sports, winning games is the goal, but at Schoolcraft, athletics are designed as an extension of the classroom, ensuring that academic and athletic achievements go hand in hand. While the competitive world is largely driven by results, every coach and staff member at Schoolcraft Athletics works with a deeper purpose: extracting peak performance while molding the values and character of each athlete, both professionally and personally.

This structure supports more than 250 student-athletes across 13 active sports. For many of these Ocelots, the blue and gold uniform is a crucial springboard, providing the high-level competition and academic support necessary to transfer to four-year university programs. It is a natural path that broadens their educational and professional horizons.

The Ocelots' roster is as diverse as the students themselves. The men's programs include baseball, basketball, bowling, cross country, golf, ice hockey,

and soccer, while the women's side competes in basketball, bowling, cross country, soccer, softball, and volleyball. Regardless of the sport, every athlete follows the core principles and mission of the athletic department: to develop student-athletes who lead both on and off the field.

The Mechanics of Balance

Waking up is just the first step. The real challenge is navigating a day where every hour is already committed. To maintain GPAs close to 3.5 or better, while remaining competitive, these student-athletes develop their own management strategies. For softball captain Kaitlyn Solberg, victory begins with pen and paper. "I like to plan each week before it starts so I can prepare myself mentally and physically," she said. By mapping out her commitments, she ensures her academic responsibilities are never neglected during the height of the season.

While Kaitlyn relies on anticipation, others find

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time in the gaps between activities on busy days. Because bowling has a unique, spaced-out rhythm, Olivia Lambert has mastered the art of multitasking. “I study between shots even on bus trips when we travel for tournaments,” she explained. This requires a high level of concentration, turning every spare minute into a productive study session to keep her routine on track.

Soccer player Jessica Clyde adopts a mental approach: compartmentalization. For her, the secret is being 100% present in the moment. “When I’m at work, I’m focused on the kids. When I’m studying, I’m focused on studying. When I play soccer, I dedicate my mind exclusively to that,” Jessica said. By refusing to let the stress of one area affect another, she preserves the energy necessary for her demanding routine.

As seen, not all systems are the same. Matthew Saval operates in what he calls “controlled chaos.” A self-proclaimed night owl, his day often starts at 10 a.m. to the iconic riff of The Rolling Stones’ “I Can’t Get No Satisfaction.” His discipline doesn’t always follow the sunrise; instead, it is a true test of willpower, with Matthew often adjusting his priorities to finish training late at night to ensure his academic obligations are met first.

Behind the Stage

Maintaining this level of excellence comes at a personal cost. Behind the statistics and game highlights are the difficult choices that define the experience of a student-athlete. For Matthew Saval, the cost is often measured in exhaustion. He admits that sometimes he puts on his shoes at 3 a.m. to finish a workout that didn’t fit into his schedule. “The next day is awful,” Matthew says honestly. “I can’t think, I have no willpower, but somehow I keep going.”

Jessica Clyde faces a similar struggle, often sacrificing hours of sleep or making the most of every minute of the team’s travel time to maintain consistency in her tasks. Even the sport itself sometimes demands sacrifices. Olivia Lambert recalls having to miss practices due to conflicting class schedules. Although it was difficult to adapt to bowling after her teammates had already started, she saw it as a lesson in professional adaptability, a necessary trade-off for her academic training.

Adaptability is a virtue that should accompany everyone, because you never know what the next action will be like. For one reason or another, at

the last minute you need to change everything and reorganize your schedule to meet all commitments.

Fortunately, these Ocelots don’t walk this path alone. A solid support system, composed of coaches and teachers, provides the necessary safety net. Hayden Broose and Jessica both emphasize the empathy found within the Schoolcraft faculty. “The coaches and professors are very understanding,” Hayden says. “Our coach always stresses that school comes first.” Whether it’s a coach setting up a personalized practice plan for Olivia or a professor granting an extension for a traveling athlete, this culture of communication ensures that being a champion on the field doesn’t come at the expense of a future career.

The Foundation for the “Next Play”

The sweat and late-night study sessions are about more than winning games; they are about building a foundation for life. Each Ocelot carries lessons that the classroom alone could never teach. Softball captain Kaitlyn Solberg credits her sport for her growth in leadership, while Matthew Saval found meaning in the struggle. After recovering from a torn ACL, he learned to “love the process,” a grit he now applies to every academic and athletic challenge.

To maintain this drive, these athletes must also find ways to unplug. Away from the pressure of competition, the Ocelots reveal a multifaceted side. Olivia Lambert finds peace in the wind ensemble or drawing to calm her mind. Hayden Brose crafts jewelry and prioritizes a social life outside the court, while Matthew turns to the high-speed world of sim racing and the classic riffs of his guitar. For Jessica Clyde, “sitting still” is rarely an option; she recharges through movement, whether lifting at the gym or walking her dog.

As the sophomore year pushes toward its conclusion, these athletes are already looking at their next play. Their paths are as diverse as their sports. While Kaitlyn dreams of transferring to a warmer climate to continue her softball career, Hayden and Matthew both eye Wayne State, she for fashion design or cosmetology, and he for Radiation Therapy. Jessica plans to pursue Exercise Science, and Olivia looks forward to a four-year university where bowling will remain a lifelong passion. Regardless of where they go, the discipline follows them. As Matthew puts it, success is like compound interest: “It’s about taking little steps each day. Even if you aim for the stars, you might hit the moon, and that’s a lot farther than if you’d never started walking.”

The Playbook for Success

For those looking to follow in their footsteps, the Ocelots offer a clear playbook: success is a blend of discipline and self-care. Kaitlyn emphasizes preparation: “Plan and write out your assignments. Surround yourself with people who want to see you succeed.” However, planning is only half the battle. Hayden and Olivia both emphasize the importance of balance and rest. “Get plenty of sleep and take care of your body and mind,” Hayden stresses. Olivia adds that she always schedules time for herself: “You need rest. Without it, you can’t perform.” It’s a lesson in patience that Jessica summarizes perfectly: “Take things one step at a time. When life feels overwhelming, focus on the present and don’t forget to take care of yourself.”

Being a student-athlete at Schoolcraft is an exhausting marathon. It demands a mastery of opportunity cost that most people don’t develop until much later in life. But through the early mornings and late-night sessions, these Ocelots are doing more than playing a game, they are developing the resilience that will define their futures. The final whistle may blow, but the skills they’ve built will remain long after the stadium lights go dark.

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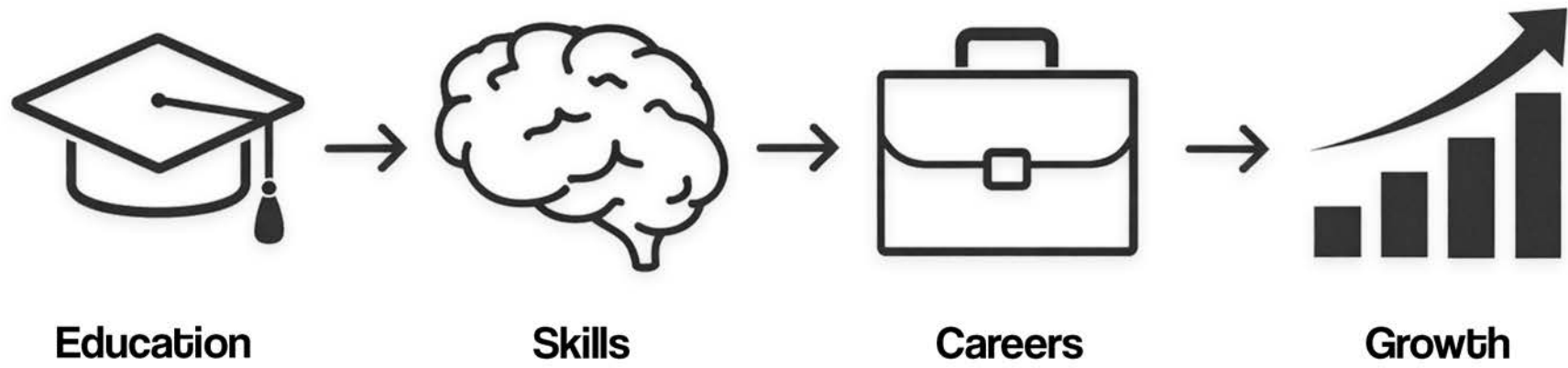
With the nursing simulation programs at Schoolcraft, students will be able to experience specific situations and will be able to perform the simulation on their own. The instructor will watch from behind a one way mirror and be able to pick up a phone connected in the room, allowing students to be completely independent. This environment enables mistakes, which will be corrected after the simulation is over where students can discuss what happened. It allows students to be in charge of their learning and feel comfortable making mistakes before having to face the real situation of a patient.

Industry partnerships are also an integral part of students’ education. By bringing companies to students, it will provide them

with integral connections that are necessary for the work force. Schoolcraft’s connection with Trinity Elite and Nino Salvaggio allows for students who are in our nursing programs and our marketing programs to develop relationships with these companies and further the connections into the field. Another great thing about Schoolcraft is the opportunity to connect with people in your field by hosting many events that students can attend for free where they can meet professionals in the degree they are looking into.

Ultimately, higher education is increasingly judged by its ability to prepare students for life beyond graduation. 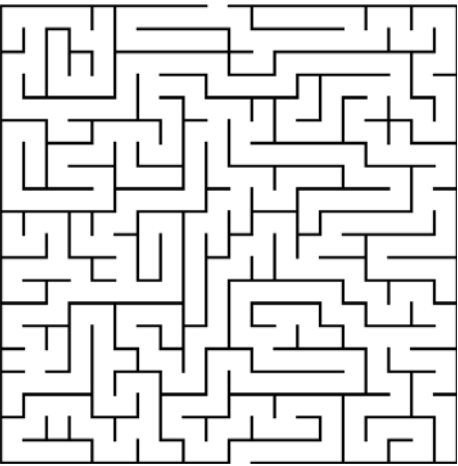

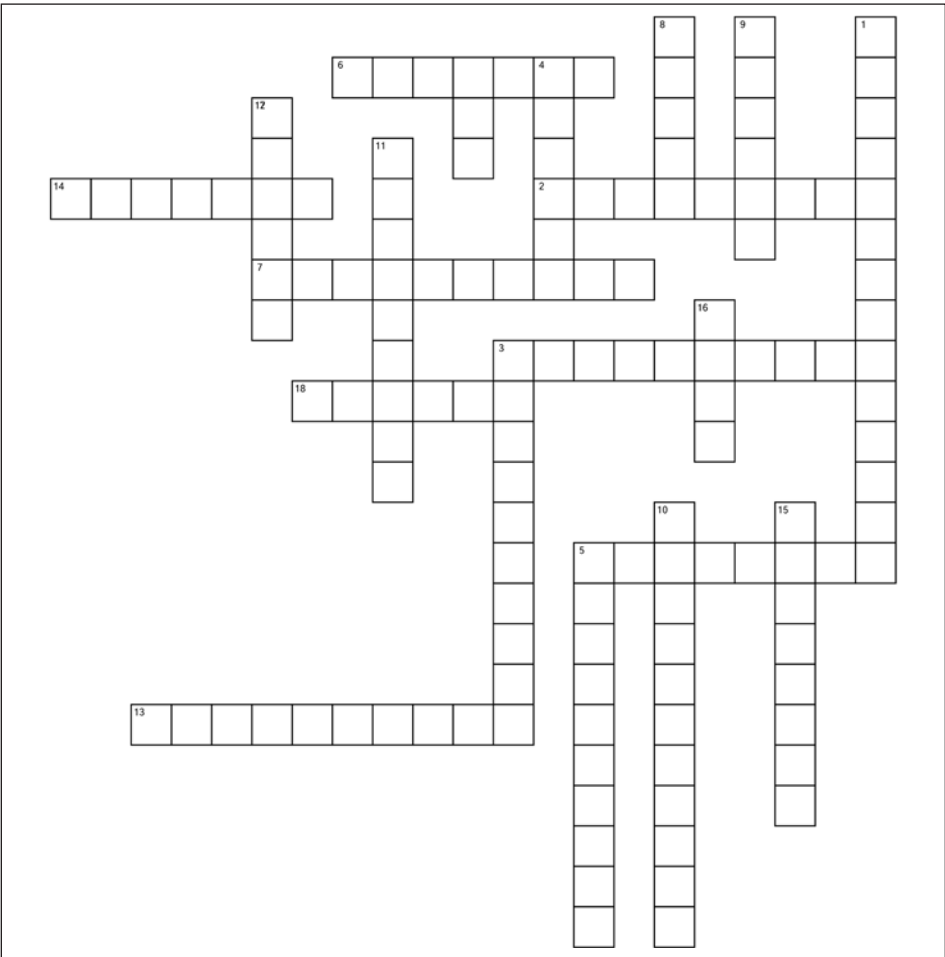
